# ALBERTA GOVERNMENT TELEPHONES

## Schedule of Rates for Service

(Exclusive of Private Branch Exchange Equipment)

### INSTALLATION CHARGES

A service connection charge covering a portion of the average cost of the initial expense of establishing service for new subscribers and of furnishing additional facilities to old subscribers shall be as follows:

- (a) For individual or exchange party line service, or extension set..... \$3.50
- (b) For each extension bell..... 2.00
- (c) To cover directory, accounting, circuit and switchboard expenses in cases where service is established by the use of instruments already in place in the subscriber's premises and no change is made in the type or location of such instruments..... 1.50
- (d) To reconnect service when discontinued for non-payment of account..... 1.00
- (e) When it is necessary to erect poles or anchors in order to carry the wires from the main telephone line on the road allowance or street to the applicant's premises, such poles and anchors in connection therewith will be supplied and erected by the Department at the expense of the applicant.

### Excess Mileage-Exchange

The excess mileage rate for Exchange Service shall be 50c per month for each quarter-mile or fraction thereof.

### MOVING CHARGES

- (1) From one position to another in same room .....\$1.00 per instrument
- (2) From one room to another on same floor, or from one floor to another in same building, no outside wiring being required.....\$2.00 per instrument
- (3) From one building to another .....\$3.50 per instrument
- (4) Where a telephone is already installed and no inside move is required, a charge of \$1.50 will be made to cover cost of transferring the wires in central office and changing number on switchboard.
- (5) The charge for an inside or outside rural move will be the entire cost incurred in doing the work.
- (6) Where the above rates do not apply, an estimate of cost will be furnished subscriber on request, previous to work being proceeded with.

# Department of Railways and Telephones

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS Under Which Telephone Service is Furnished

### USE OF TELEPHONE

1. Telephone instruments and connecting lines are furnished to subscribers to be used in accordance with the rules as prescribed by the Department from time to time, and are to be used only by the subscriber, his agents or employees when engaged upon his business and must not be used for transmitting, receiving or delivering any message or communication in respect of which a consideration has been or is to be paid by any other party, except as permitted by the rules of the Department, nor used in any way in competition with the telephone business conducted by the Department. Subscribers will not be allowed to transfer their telephone number, service, or contract to any other party, unless arranged for in advance by a duly authorized official of the Department.

The right of the subscriber is to use the instruments and connecting lines where the Department may place them, but not elsewhere, under such rules as the Department may from time to time prescribe. He shall not extend their use to other individuals, except his servants upon his business; nor shall they be used for any calls or consideration to be paid by any person other than the subscriber; nor does this confer upon him the right to use any other instrument.

2. The lines and instruments over which the service is furnished remain the property of the Government and subscribers must not use or permit any electrical or mechanical connection or apparatus being made with the said lines or instruments without the written consent of the Department.

### CONSTRUCTION

3. When it is necessary to erect poles or anchors in order to carry the wires from the main telephone line on the road allowance or street to the applicant's premises, such poles and anchors in connection therewith will be supplied and erected by the Department at the expense of the applicant.

### CHARGES—HOW PAID

4. All charges for installations, moves and monthly rentals shall be paid in advance, which shall entitle the subscriber to service with all subscribers connected to the same exchange. Regular toll rates will be charged for all service to points outside of the exchange.

5. Subscribers shall pay the installation charges, first rental instalment (and construction charges, if any) strictly in advance. Excess mileage charge will be added if outside of exchange limits. If subsequent rental accounts remain unpaid after the 20th of the month, service shall be discontinued and if still remaining unpaid after the end of the month, a charge of \$1.00 shall be made to reconnect service; no rebate or reduction shall be allowed for such interruption to service.

6. Subscribers shall pay monthly, at schedule rates, for all messages and conversations over the Long Distance lines. If said accounts remain unpaid after the 20th of the month, further credit shall be refused until account is paid.

7. Subscribers shall pay promptly, upon presentation of account, all charges for other miscellaneous items. If these charges are not paid within 20 days, service shall be discontinued.

### COMPLAINTS RE LONG DISTANCE SERVICE

8. No allowance will be made on complaint of inefficient Long Distance service unless such complaint be made to Chief Operator, immediately after conversation has taken place.



## VACATION ALLOWANCE

9. Should a subscriber desire to have his **Exchange Residence Service** temporarily discontinued, owing to the closing of his residence, he may do so without cancelling contract or having telephone removed, and, if arranged for in advance in writing, an allowance of one-half of the rate per month will be made for a period of not less than one month and not exceeding three months in any one year. Subscriber shall state, when making application, the period for which he expects to be absent and shall pay for this period in advance. Subscriber will notify the Department when he wishes service resumed, either in writing or by calling at the office and signing re-connect order.

## MOVES

10. The telephone is first located where the subscriber directs and must not be moved or interfered with. When the subscriber desires to have the telephone moved to any other location, notice in writing should be given to the local office, at least ten days before the change is desired. The work will then be done as promptly as possible at regular charges.

## CANCELLATION OF SERVICE

11. Subscribers giving up service must notify the Department in writing, or call at office and sign "Take Out" order. Failing to do this, subscriber will be liable for rent up to the date instrument is removed or taken over by a new subscriber.

## GENERAL

12. If a telephone installed for service at the residence rate be used for the purposes of a business or profession, or otherwise than for the usual requirements of a residence, the Department may charge the business rate for such service without regard to the date to which the subscriber has paid for service at the residence rate. This also applies to subscribers, for residence service only, who advertise or use their telephone number in connection with their business or profession.

13. The Department will endeavor to keep the lines and instruments in good working order and undertake to clear trouble or make repairs with all reasonable despatch, but does not guarantee uninterrupted service.

14. A subscriber's telephone number is not a part of the application for service, but numbers will only be changed when absolutely necessary or for the betterment of the service.

15. The use of obscene, profane or abusive language while using the telephone is strictly forbidden and service may be immediately discontinued for violation of this rule.

## DIRECTORY REGULATIONS

This Directory is the property of the Alberta Government and is loaned to telephone subscribers for their use, to be retained until the delivery of the next issue. Subscribers are furnished free one copy for each instrument. Additional copies will be charged for, 50c per copy.

Copy for Directory information for the next issue of the Directory will be closed May 15th, 1922.

The next issue will be published July 1st, 1922.

No insertions, changes or corrections may be made after the date set for the closing of copy.

Each subscriber is entitled to one single line entry in the Alphabetical List without charge. Listings in bold type will be charged at the rate of Two Dollars per issue. By special arrangement any subscriber to Exchange Business Service may have the name of any company which he represents, or of any employee or agent, listed in Directory at a nominal charge of One Dollar per line per issue. A subscriber to Exchange Residence service may have the name of a bona fide member of his family listed in the Directory for One Dollar per line per issue. When it is desired to insert the name of a person not an actual member of the family, the charge will be Three Dollars per issue, which includes Exchange Service.

Subscribers are requested to report promptly to the Local Office, in writing, any errors which may appear in this Directory, so that same may be corrected in the next issue.

# INSTRUCTIONS

## FOR USE OF AUTOMATIC TELEPHONE AT Calgary, Lethbridge and Medicine Hat

CONSULT THE DIRECTORY IN ALL CASES BEFORE PLACING A CALL.  
DO NOT TRUST TO YOUR MEMORY.

- (1) Remove receiver from hook before operating dial.
  - (2) Bring the finger squarely to the finger stop.
- IMPORTANT.—When calling a number, allow a slight interval to elapse between each figure.
- (3) Face the transmitter, with the lips almost touching the mouthpiece. Speak naturally, distinctly and not too rapidly.
  - (4) Do not move receiver hook or dial while talking, as this will disconnect you.
  - (5) Always hang up receiver for a short interval before making a second call, to allow the mechanism to release.
  - (6) Hang receiver on hook (small end up) when through talking; otherwise no one can obtain connection with your telephone.
  - (7) BUSY BUZZ. If, after calling a number, a buzzing sound is heard, it indicates that the number called for is busy.

### EXAMPLE

To call M2300—Remove receiver from hook, place finger in finger-hole "M" and pull dial down until finger reaches the finger-stop; let dial rotate back; then in same manner pull 2-3-0-0.

Dial will rotate back. Do not interfere with this backward motion.

Place receiver to your ear. If the busy buzz is heard, it indicates that M2300 is busy. This being the case, hang up the receiver and call again within a reasonable time.

At completion of conversation, hang receiver on hook, small end up.

You are now entirely disconnected and ready to call another number or to be called.

If a mistake is made in calling the correct number or if the dial is improperly operated, the receiver must be hung up before calling again. If connection is accidentally broken it should be restored by the calling party. When using an extension telephone, listen and speak before operating dial.

## AUTOMATIC EXCHANGES

### INFORMATION

Call "Information" for NUMBERS of New Subscribers, Changes, Long Distance Line Charges, New Toll Offices, etc.

### TROUBLE

Complaints regarding Telephone Troubles should be reported to Trouble Operator. When reporting trouble, give telephone number affected and its location, also state as accurately as possible just how trouble manifests itself. Try to be specific as incomplete information frequently causes delay in locating nature of trouble. If a line you are trying to call repeatedly tests "busy" notify Trouble Clerk, who will investigate whether same is caused by an abnormal condition on line or from use. If any line appears too busy for good service, write to the Commercial Manager. Subscribers are requested not to engage Trouble or Information Clerks in conversation longer than necessary, as by so doing the clerk will be prevented from giving prompt attention to other patrons.



# INSTRUCTIONS

## FOR USE OF MANUAL TELEPHONE

CONSULT THE DIRECTORY IN ALL CASES BEFORE PLACING A CALL.  
DO NOT TRUST TO YOUR MEMORY.

To call the Operator, give *one long ring* before removing the receiver from the hook, and then hold the receiver to the ear. When the Operator replies by saying, "Number?" give the number of the subscriber's telephone desired, slowly and distinctly. At multi office exchanges, first indicate the exchange desired by the prefixed letter and then pronounce the number by digits.

*For example:*—"M1429" should be pronounced "M one-four-two-nine."

At other exchanges pronounce the number desired by digits.

*For example:*—"175" should be pronounced "One-seven-five."

*Note.*—To call the operator at Camrose or Wetaskiwin (Common Battery exchanges), remove the receiver from the hook and proceed as instructed above.

When finished talking, place the receiver on the hook, small end up. No ringing, except by rural line subscribers, is necessary at these exchanges.

Keep the receiver to the ear, and the Operator, after repeating the number, will connect you with the Subscriber called for. If the desired line is found to be in use, the Operator will report "Line Busy."

When you have finished talking, place the receiver on the hook, small end up, and give a *short ring*. This gives the Operator a signal to disconnect, and you are then in a position to call another number, or to be called.

ANSWER THE CALLS ON YOUR TELEPHONE PROMPTLY BY ANNOUNCING YOUR TELEPHONE NUMBER.

Face the Transmitter, with the lips almost touching the mouthpiece. Speak naturally, distinctly, and not too rapidly.

Call "Information" for subscribers or changes not found in this Directory.

**DO NOT USE THE TELEPHONE DURING A THUNDER-STORM.**

Rural line subscribers should limit their local conversations to FIVE MINUTES duration, and must not "listen-in" to conversations not intended for them, as it interferes with the service.

### COMPLAINTS

Complaints regarding telephone trouble and unsatisfactory service should be made to the Agent or Chief Operator at the office concerned, and if not rectified within a reasonable time the matter should be referred to the Traffic Superintendent at Edmonton.

## NOTICE

TO TELEPHONE SUBSCRIBERS  
AND THE PUBLIC



All employees of the Alberta Government Telephones whose duties require them to enter the premises of subscribers or others, are required to wear a badge similar to that illustrated above. The public is hereby notified to require all persons who desire to enter their buildings or premises for purposes in connection with the Telephone to exhibit their badges and note the numbers of the same. Any person claiming to be an employee of the Alberta Government Telephones, who is without this badge, should be refused admission and the Local Agent be notified at once by telephone.



# LONG DISTANCE SERVICE

## Rules and Regulations

To make a Long Distance Call:—

(a) If you desire Station-to-Station service call "Long Distance" in the regular way. When the Long Distance operator answers, give the Number of the telephone from which you are speaking and say, "I want to speak to.....(telephone number).....(terminating office). Anybody at that number will do."

(b) If you desire to reach a particular person at a certain telephone number or address, call "Long Distance" in the regular way. When the Long Distance operator answers give the Number of the telephone from which you are speaking, also your name and initials together with the initials and name of the particular person desired and the city or town where he can be located.

**Example:—**Number 4567, J. H. Brown speaking. "I want to speak to Mr. John Jones No. 684 Springdale," or "I want to speak to anyone who can talk business at No. 684 Springdale," or "If Mr. Jones is not there I will speak to Mr. A. F. Smith."

(c) If you desire to place an Appointment or Messenger call, or transmit a Written Message or Telegram, call "Long Distance" in the regular way and give your order as heretofore.

**Long Distance Charges.**—All rates quoted are for an initial period of three minutes. For over-time beyond the initial period a proportionate charge is made per minute.

**Long Distance Tolls** will be charged to the subscriber from whose instrument the Long Distance call is placed.

**Night Rates.**—Evening and Night Rates apply only to Station-to-Station calls. See page 10 for further information. Day rates only are in effect between Alberta and Saskatchewan Government Telephones' points. The Kootenay Telephone Lines, Ltd. (B.C.) Day and Night Rates are the same.

**Supervision by Private Branch Exchange Operators.**—The Long Distance operator is held responsible for the supervision and timing of all messages and for the character of the service furnished. Supervision of connections by Private Branch Exchange operators interferes with the service and such operators should not remain "cut in" on the line after the connection has been established.

**Reversal of Charges.**—All charges will be made against the Originating Office except those messages for which the receiving party expressly agrees to pay. The assent of the receiving party to a reversal of charges should be obtained before the connection is established.

**Messenger Service.**—Upon request, and the pre-payment of reasonable charges a messenger will be sent when possible to notify a non-subscriber to come to any Public Pay Station.

When a Particular Person is desired the Long Distance operator must be so advised when the call is placed, otherwise charges will be made from the time connection is established with the telephone desired, whether the party required is obtained or not.

**Slot Machine Pay Station Service.**—Slot Machine Telephones have been installed by the Department, for the convenience of subscribers and the general public, in suitable locations throughout the City.

Local conversations may be had from these Telephones at a charge of 5 cents for 5 minutes.

Long Distance service is furnished at regular tariff rates upon deposit of the amount of the initial charge (covering three minutes' conversation), the usual charges being made for excess time.

Non-subscribers who desire to use subscribers' telephones should be referred to the nearest Public Pay Station.

**COMPLAINTS** regarding unsatisfactory Long Distance service should be made to the Chief Operator at the office concerned, and if not then rectified, the matter should be referred to the Traffic Superintendent, Edmonton.

If there is anything about our rates and practices you do not fully understand, please call your Local Manager or Chief Operator and they will be glad to explain.

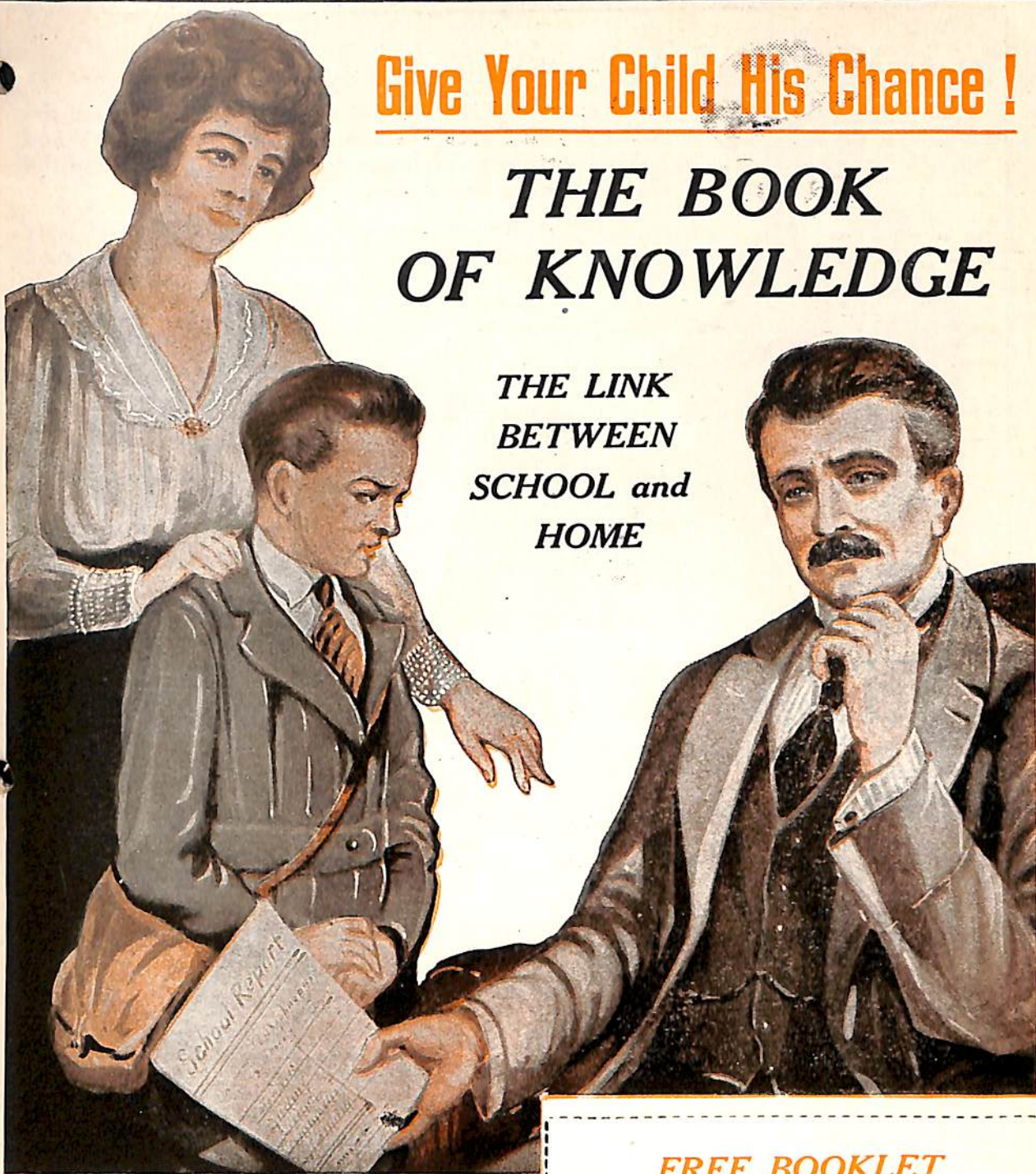

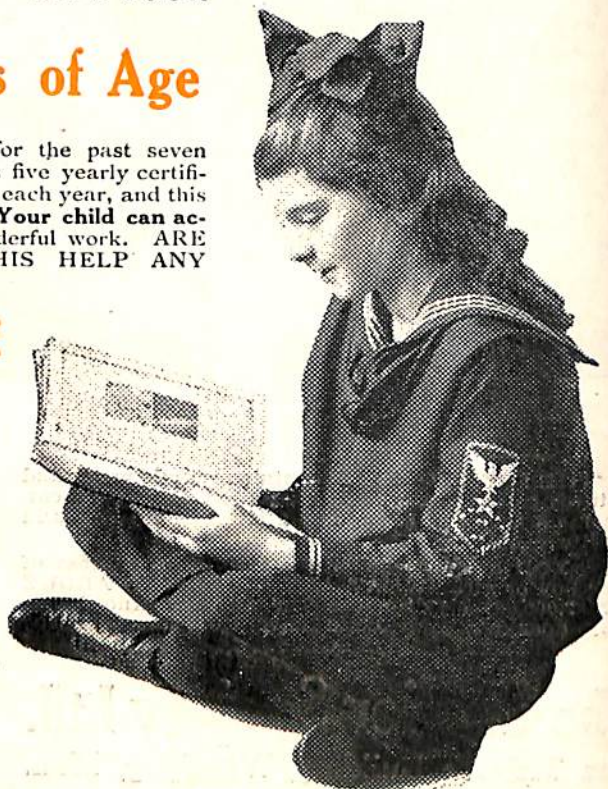
