Terms and Conditions

Under Which Telephone Service is Furnished

USE OF TELEPHONE

1. Telephone instruments and connecting lines are furnished to subscribers to be used in accordance with the rules as prescribed by the Department from time to time, and are to be used only by the subscriber, his agents or employees when engaged upon his business and must not be used for transmitting, receiving or delivering any message or communication in respect of which a consideration has been or is to be paid by any other party, except as permitted by the rules of the Department, nor used in any way in competition with the telephone business conducted by the Department. Subscribers will not be allowed to transfer their telephone number, service, or contract to any other party, unless arranged for in advance by a duly authorized official of the Department.

The right of the subscriber is to use the instruments and connecting lines where the Department may place them, but not elsewhere, under such rules as the Department may from time to time prescribe. He shall not extend their use to other individuals, except his servants upon his business; nor shall they be used for any calls or consideration to be paid by any person other than the subscriber; nor does this confer upon him the right to use any other instrument.

2. The lines and instruments over which the service is furnished remain the property of the Alberta Government Telephones and shall be carefully used by the subscriber, and only as herein stated in Clause No. 1; and no instrument or appliance not furnished by the Department shall be attached to or used in connection with these lines and instruments.

CONSTRUCTION

3. When it is necessary to erect poles or anchors in order to carry the wires from the main telephone line on the road allowance or street to the applicant's premises, such poles and anchors in connection therewith will be supplied and erected by the Department at the expense of the applicant.

CHARGES-HOW PAID

4. All charges for installations, moves, and monthly rentals shall be paid in advance, which shall entitle the subscriber to service with all subscribers connected to the same exchange. Regular toll rates will be charged for all service to points outside of the exchange.

5. Subscribers shall pay the installation charges, first rental instalment (and construction charges if any) strictly in advance. Excess mileage charge will be added if outside of exchange limits. If subsequent rental accounts remain unpaid after the 20th of the month, service shall be discontinued and if still remaining unpaid after the end of the month, a charge of \$1.00 shall be made to reconnect service; no rebate or reduction shall be allowed for such interruption to service.

6. Subscribers shall pay monthly, at schedule rates, for all messages and conversations over the Long Distance lines. If said accounts remain unpaid after the 20th of the month, further credit shall be refused until account is paid.

7. Subscribers shall pay promptly, upon presentation of account, all charges for other miscellaneous items. If these charges are not paid within 20 days, service shall be discontinued.

COMPLAINTS RE LONG DISTANCE SERVICE

8. No allowance will be made on complaint of inefficient Long Distance service unless such complaint be made to Chief Operator, immediately after conversation has taken place.

VACATION ALLOWANCE

9. Should a subscriber desire to have his Exchange Residence Service temporarily discontinued, owing to the closing of his residence, he may do so without cancelling contract or having telephone removed, and, if arranged for in advance in writing, an allowance of one-half of the rate per month will be made for a period of not less than one month and not exceeding three months in any one year. Subscriber shall state, when making application, the period for which he expects to be absent and shall pay for this period in advance. Subscriber will notify the Department when he wishes service resumed, either in writing or by calling at the office and signing re-connect order. Owing to the fact that Rural Telephones cannot be disconnected without and write office and signing re-connect order. be disconnected without a special trip being made to their location, this regulation will not apply to Rural Subscribers.

MOVES

10. The telephone is first located where the subscriber directs and must not be moved or interfered with. When the subscriber desires to have the telephone moved to any other location, notice in writing should be given to the local office, at least ten days before the change is desired. The work will then be done as promptly as possible at regular charges. possible at regular charges.

CANCELLATION OF SERVICE

11. Subscribers giving up service must notify the Department in writing, or call at office and sign "Take Out" order. Failing to do this, subscriber will be liable for all charges up to date instrument is removed or taken over by a new subscriber.

IDENTIFICATION OF EMPLOYES

12. Every employee of the Alberta Government Telephones authorized to instal, inspect, repair or remove the Department's apparatus carries a metal badge showing the name of the Alberta Government Telephones and his own number. Subscribers and others are earnestly requested to refuse access to their premises to anyone who cannot in this way identify himself, and to notify the Local Office at once by telephone.

GENERAL

13. If a telephone installed for service at the residence rate be used for the purposes of business or profession, or otherwise than for the usual requirements of a residence, the Department may charge the business rate for such service without regard to the date to which the subscriber has paid for service at the residence rate. This also applies to subscribers, for residence service only, who advertise or use their telephone number in connection with their business or profession.

14. The Department will endeavor to keep the lines and instruments in good working order and undertakes to clear trouble or make repairs with all reasonable despatch, but does not guarantee uninterrupted service.

15. A subscriber's telephone number is not a part of the application for service, but numbers will only be changed when absolutely necessary or for the betterment of the service.

The use of obscene, profane or abusive language while using the telephone 16. is strictly forbidden and service may be immediately discontinued for violation of this rule.

DIRECTORY REGULATIONS

This Directory is the property of the Alberta Government Telephones and is loaned to subscribers for their use, to be retained until the delivery of the next issue. Sub-scribers are furnished free one copy for each instrument. Additional copies will be charged for, 50c. per copy.

CLOSING COPY

Directory copies will be closed on the following dates, and all new names, changes or corrections, must be furnished the Local Office in writing, previous to these dates. No entries may be made after the dates set:

The right is reserved to change dates of publication from time to time as may be necessary to meet the requirements of the Telephone service, without notice.

Each subscriber is entitled to one single line entry in the Alphabetical List without charge. Listings in bold type will be charged at the rate of \$2.50 per issue. By special arrangement any subscriber to Exchange Business Service may have the name of any company which he represents listed in directory as an extra insertion at a charge of \$1.50 per issue for light face type, or \$2.50 per issue for bold type. A subscriber to Exchange Residence service may have the name of a bona fide member of his family listed in the Directory for One Dollar per line per issue.

Each business subscriber is entitled to one single-line entry in the Classified business section without charge. Listings in bold type will be charged at the rate of Two Dollars per issue. All other listings will be charged for in accordance with approved schedule of rates.

Subscribers are requested to report promptly to the Local Office, in writing, any errors which may appear in this Directory, so that same may be corrected in the next issue.

The Alberta Government Telephones assume no liability whatever for damages occurring through errors or omissions in the making up and printing of this Directory.

HOW TO USE THE TELEPHONE

AUTOMATIC TELEPHONE

Consult the Telephone Directory for the correct | number before you make a call. Do not trust to your memory.

Call "92" for Information if the person or firm you wish to call is not listed in the Directory.

I. LIFT RECEIVER off the hook before making a call. Do not work the hook up and down when doing so, as it interferes with the calling mechanism.

2. BRING THE FINGER squarely to the finger stop.

3. REMOVE YOUR FINGER after each operation and allow the dial to rotate back to its normal position. Do not force or retard this movement.

4. FACE THE TRANSMITTER with the lips almost touching the mouthpiece. Speak naturally, distinctly and not too rapidly. 5. DO NOT MOVE RECEIVER HOOK OR

DIAL, while talking, as this will disconnect you. 6. DO NOT LEAVE RECEIVER OFF HOOK DURING THE NIGHT or your line will be disconnected from service. Call "Trouble

Department, Telephone 93" should you desire your service temporarily disconnected during the night.

ALWAYS HANG UP RECEIVER for a 7. short interval before making a second call to allow the mechanism to release.

8. HANG RECEIVER ON HOOK (small end up) when through talking; otherwise no one can obtain connection with your telephone. 9. BUSY BUZZ sound indicates that the num-

ber called for is busy.

ber called for is busy. EXAMPLE:—To call M2300. Lift receiver off the hook, place finger in finger hole "M," then turn the dial towards the right until your finger strikes the finger stop. Then release dial and allow it to rotate back to its normal position. Repeat this operation for the figures 2-3-0-0.

Place receiver to your ear. If the busy buzz is heard, it indicates that the number called is busy. This being the case, hang receiver on hook and call again within a reasonable time.

AUTOMATIC EXCHANGES

INFORMATION :- Call Information "92" for

numbers of New Subscribers, Changes, Long Dis-tance Line Charges, New Toll Offices, etc. TROUBLE:—Complaints regarding Telephone Troubles should be reported to Trouble Operator, Telephone No. 93. When reporting trouble, give telephone number affected and its location, also state as accurately as possible just how trouble manifests itself. Try to be specific, as incomplete information frequently causes delay in locating nature of trouble.

If a line you are trying to call repeatedly tests "busy," notify Trouble Operator, who will inves-tigate whether same is caused by an abnormal condition on line, or from use. If any line appears too busy for good Service, write to the Commercial Manager. Subscribers are requested not to engage Trouble or Information Operators in conversation longer than necessary, as by so doing the operator will be prevented from giving prompt attention to other patrons.

MANUAL TELEPHONE

Consult the Telephone Directory for the correct | number before you make a call. Do not trust to your memory.

Ask for "Information" if the person or firm

you wish to call is not listed in the Directory. I. TO CALL THE OPERATOR give one long ring before removing the receiver from the hook and then hold the receiver to the ear.

2. WHEN THE OPERATOR REPLIES by saying "Number?" give the number of the sub-scriber's telephone desired, slowly and distinctly. At Multi-office Exchanges, first indicate the exchange desired by the prefixed letter and then pronounce the number by digit.

EXAMPLE.—"M1420" should be pronounced "M one-four-two-nine."

At other Exchanges pronounce the number desired by digits.

EXAMPLE:--"175" should be pronounced "One-Seven-Five."

3. FACE THE TRANSMITTER with the lips almost touching the mouthpiece. Speak naturally, distinctly, and not too rapidly.

4. KEEP THE RECEIVER TO THE EAR, and the Operator, after repeating the number, will connect you with the subscriber called for. If ton

the desired line is found to be in use the operator will report "Line Busy."

WHEN YOU HAVE FINISHED TALK-ING place the receiver on the hook, small end up, and give a short ring. This gives the opera-tor a signal to disconnect and you are then in a position to call another number or to be called.

NOTE:—At Camrose, Red Deer and Wetas-kiwin (Common Battery Exchanges) no ring-ing, except by rural line subscribers, is necessary. Simply remove receiver from hook and in all other respects proceed as instructed above, placing the receiver on the hook when conversation is finished.

6. DO NOT USE THE TELEPHONE during a thunderstorm.

7. RURAL LINE SUBSCRIBERS should limit their conversation to Five Minutes duration and must not "listen in" to conversations not in-

tended for them, as it interferes with the Service. COMPLAINTS:-Complaints regarding tele-phone trouble and unsatisfactory Service should be made to the Local Manager, Agent or Chief Operator at the Office concerned, and if not rectified within a reasonable time, the matter should be referred to the Traffic Superintendent at Edmon-

LONG DISTANCE SERVICE

Rules and Regulations

To make a Long Distance Call, first call "Long Distance"—when the Long Distance Operator answers, give her your telephone number, followed by the details of your call as indicated below.

CLASSIFICATION OF LONG DISTANCE SERVICE

1. STATION TO STATION CALLS

The Station-to-Station rate applies when it is not desired to establish communication between particular persons.

Station-to-Station calls must be made by number whenever Telephone Directory information covering the called point is available. When such information is not available, the name or address under which the telephone is listed should be given, specifying that "anyone at that number will do."

> EXAMPLE :--- "Number 4567, J.H. Brown speaking, I want to speak to Springdale, No. 684," or "I want to speak to Springdale, anyone at Mr. John Jones' residence (or business) telephone."

2. PERSON-TO-PERSON CALLS

(Evening and Night Rates do not apply to Person-to-Person Service.)

When a Long Distance Call is made, specifying that conversation is desired with a particular person and the connection is established and conversation held with that person, the "Person-to-Person" rate applies.

> EXAMPLE :--- "Number 4567 J. H. Brown speaking, I want to speak to Springdale, No. 684, Mr. John Jones," or "If Mr. Jones is not there, I will speak to Mr. A. F. Smith."

NOTE: When a particular person is desired, the Long Distance operator must be so advised when the call is placed, otherwise charges will be made from the time connection is established with the telephone desired, whether the party is obtained or not.

Appointment Calls

An appointment Call is a Person-to-Person call requiring communication to be established at a specified time, and order should be given to the Long Distance operator in the usual manner.

Messenger Calls

A Messenger Call is a Person-to-Person call, necessitating the services of a Messenger to secure the attendance of a specified person, and order should be given to the Long Distance operator in the usual manner. The Messenger Service and Report charges in such cases must be prepaid by the calling party if the call is placed from a Public Pay Station.

Collect Calls

Collect calls are Person-to-Person Calls, the charges for which are reversed, *i.e.*, to be collected from the called party. In such cases the assent of the called party shall be obtained before the connection is established.

LONG DISTANCE SERVICE Rules and Regulations—Continued

RATES AND CHARGES FOR LONG DISTANCE SERVICE

Long Distance Tolls will be charged to the subscriber from whose instrument the Long Distance call is placed, except those messages for which the receiving party expressly agrees to pay on the basis of a Person-to-Person Call.

All rates quoted are for an initial period of three minutes. For overtime beyond the initial period a proportionate charge is made per minute.

The rates quoted on pages 9 and 10 are Station-to-Station Day Rates.

The Day rate for a Station-to-Station call is the fundamental rate upon which the rates for other classes of Service are based.

The rate for a completed Person-to-Person call, either Paid or Collect is approximately 25% higher than the corresponding Station-to-Station Day rate.

The rate for a completed Appointment or Messenger Call, including Written Messages and Telegrams, is approximately 50 per cent. higher than the corresponding Station-to-Station day rate.

Day rates only are used in computing charges on Person-to-Person, Appointment and Messenger Calls, including Written Messages and Telegrams.

Day rates only are in effect between points served by the Alberta Government and Saskatchewan Government Telephones.

The Kootenay Telephone Lines Ltd. (B.C.) Day and Night Rates are the same.

Evening and Night Rates

(These rates apply on Station-to-Station Calls only.)

Between 7 p.m. and 12 midnight the Station-to-Station rates are approximately one-half the Day rates and are known as "Evening Rates."

Between 12 midnight and 4.30 a.m. the Station-to-Station rates are approximately one-fourth the Day Rates and are known as "Night Rates."

(NOTE :-- In no case shall the Evening or Night rate, as the case may be, be less than 25c for the initial period, unless the Day rate is less, in which case the Day, Evening and Night Rates shall be the same.)

Report Charges

Under certain conditions a Report Charge of approximately one-quarter of the Station-to-Station Day rate will be made on uncompleted Person-to-Person, Appointment and Messenger Calls, including Written Messages and Telegrams.

A Report Charge shall not be made on a Station-to-Station call under any condition.

PAY STATION SERVICE

Pay Station Telephones have been installed by the Department for the convenience of subscribers and the general public, in suitable locations throughout the Province, Local conversations may be had from these telephones at a charge of 5 cents for 5 minutes. Long Distance Service is furnished at regular tariff rates upon deposit of the amount of the initial charge (covering three minutes conversation) the usual charges being made for excess time.

Non-subscribers who desire to use Subscribers' telephones should be referred to the nearest Public Pay Station.

If there is anything about our rates and practices you do not fully understand, please call our Local Manager or Chief Operator and they will be glad to explain.
